Dear BOEMRE,

Please accept my comments on the proposal to revise regulations regarding non-competitive acquisition of an Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) renewable energy lease. Although supportive of consensus-based renewable energy development, it seems the rush to construct renewable energy projects at all costs is being put above a reasonable and thoughtful review of the impacts of those projects on the environment, economy and coastal stakeholders. This is clearly seen in the case of the proponent-driven review of the Cape Wind project.

I urge you to reject the proposed rule. This rule would decrease competition and create a process where developers would be able to grab areas in the OCS without having their proposals compete. In addition, the public review process to ensure the public's input would be greatly marginalized.
