Professor Smith received his Ph.D. in political science from U.C. Berkeley in 1982. After teaching at Brandeis University and Columbia University, he joined the U.C. Santa Barbara Political Science Department in 1986. His research focuses mainly on public opinion, elections, and environmental politics. In the area of public opinion, he has investigated problems such as how both citizens and members of Congress organize their opinions about politics, how people learn about politics, and how their knowledge influences their opinions. In the area of environmental politics, he has investigated how the public and political activists view energy problems, and the demands they place on decision-makers. He recently completed a book on public opinion toward offshore oil development, nuclear power, and related energy and environmental issues—*Energy, the Environment, and Public Opinion* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2002). Professor Smith is also affiliated with the Environmental Studies Program at U.C. Santa Barbara.
